Pain relief (analgesia) is given before surgery; each individual pet may express pain or discomfort in different ways. For this reason, it may be necessary to provide extra pain relief once your pet is back home, this will help with recovery from surgery. This will be done at the vet's discretion. The additional charge will range depending on the weight of your animal.

Fluid therapy is recommended for pets undergoing anaesthetic to help metabolise the anaesthetic and speed recovery, especially pets over 8 years of age, pets with pre-existing conditions and those who have been slower to recover from anaesthesia in the past. This will incur an additional cost – approximately \$26 for cats and \$46 for dogs
